LITERACY FACTS

DEFINITIONS:

<u>LITERACY</u> - is the ability to read, write and comprehend at a capable level. A person is considered to be "literate" if they can read and write at an 8th grade level or above. <u>ILLITERACY</u> - is being unable to read or write.

In the United States, there is an epidemic of Americans who CANNOT READ!

CHILDREN LITERACY

• 25 MILLION CHILDREN IN THE U.S. CANNOT READ AT THEIR GRADE LEVEL!!!

- 1. Reading scores were dropping even before the pandemic.
- 2. Nearly two-thirds of U.S. students were unable to read at grade level.
- 3. Scores had been getting worse for several years.
- 4. Without help, these students will fall further behind and may even drop out of school.

• The Covid-19 pandemic had a devastating effect on American schoolchildren.

- 1. Math and reading dropped to their lowest levels in 20 years!
- 2. Black and Latino students in kindergarten through 2nd grade have been affected the most by learning losses.
- 4. Children with disabilities and those who do not speak English were affected even more.

• The first three years of schooling (Kindergarten to 2nd grade) are the most important times to learn basic reading skills.

1. However, 1/3 of children entering kindergarten lack the basic language skills needed to learn how to read.

• There are large gaps in the reading skills of low-income and minority students.

- 1. By the time children from low-income minority families enter grade school, their ability to learn reading skills is already lagging behind.
- 2. Almost half of fourth graders from low-income families read below the basic level.
- 3. And over half of African American fourth graders scored below the basic level for reading, as did 45% of Latino and 50% of Native American fourth graders.

- A lack of reading skills is a key reason for students to drop out of high school.
 - 1. Over 8,000 students quit high school every day. This fact limits their ability to get a good paying job.
 - 2. High-school-only graduates earn \$17,500 less per year than those with four-year college degrees.
 - 3. For those without a high school diploma or equivalent, the earnings gap is even greater.
 - 4. In fact, the 2020 recession caused by the COVID-19 pandemic saw adults with less than a high school diploma suffer the highest unemployment rate compared to all other education levels.

ADULT LITERACY

MILLIONS OF AMERICAN ADULTS READ BELOW THE LEVEL NEEDED TO EARN A DECENT PAYCHECK!!!

- According to the U.S. Department of Education, <u>over half</u> of all adults are "functionally illiterate." This means that about *130 million people* (16-74 years old) read below a 6th-grade level.
 - 1. In fact, 54 million adults cannot read or write at all.
 - 2. And 43 million adults in the U.S. read at a third-grade level.
- The literacy crisis has far-reaching implications for society and the workforce
 - 1. Low levels of adult literacy could cost the U.S. \$2.2 trillion a year.
 - 2. Lack of reading skills severely affects several important factors in a person's life such as: personal income, employment level, health, future goals, and retirement options.
